

Caring for the Aging Pet

Cats and dogs age much quicker than humans as you can see by the charts below. For example a seven year old West Highland Terrier is actually in its 40's in dog years.

Just like us, as they reach their senior years, they become more prone to common conditions and diseases such as arthritis, diabetes, heart disease, liver disease and many forms of cancer. As owners, it is important that we look for the signs of aging so that we can ensure that our pets can enjoy their older years to their full potential.

Decreased Mobility

Many owners put a lack of enthusiasm for walks or general inactivity down to their pet getting on a bit; however there can be many reasons for this. Joint pain due to arthritis, damage or

excess weight can see a noticeable reduction in a pet's activity level or surprisingly it can also be a sign of senility.

Weight Gain

As with humans, as animals get older, their nutritional needs change. The amount of calories an older pet requires reduces both once they are neutered, as well as when they get older. However weight gain can also be a sign that something more serious is wrong or can aggravate other conditions such as joint problems and so it is well worth keeping in check.

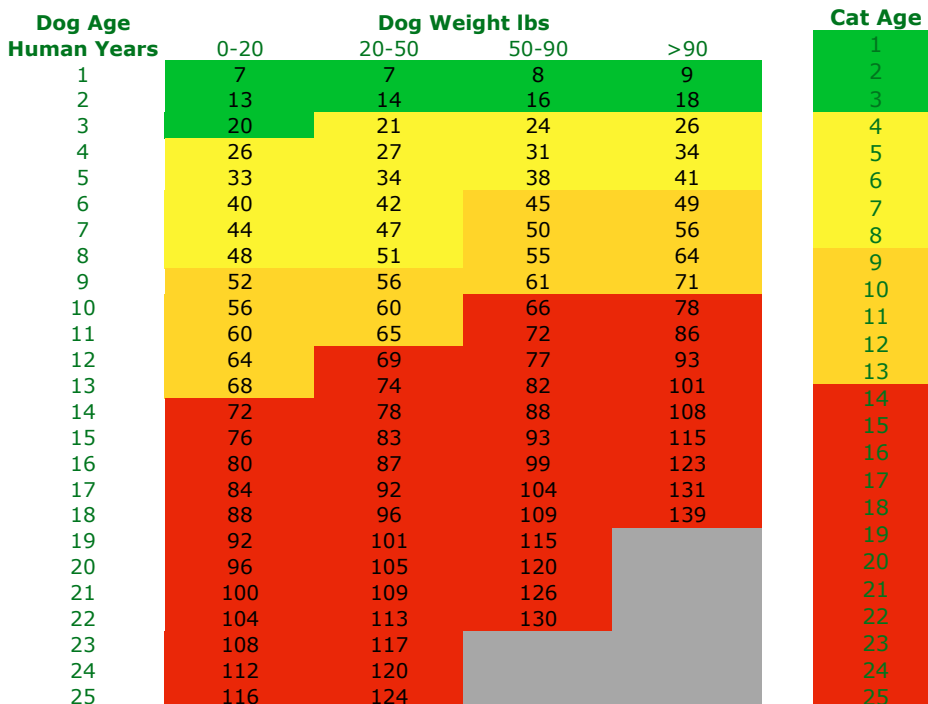
Change to Body Condition

An animals' skin, teeth and oral health can deteriorate with age. These issues can benefit from the addition of certain supplements or treatment and make a huge difference to an animals'



quality of life – after all, no one wants to walk around with toothache or itchy, sore skin.

Pet MOT's for Older Pets

We can detect conditions before your pet may even be showing symptoms/clinical signs and just as with human, earlier diagnosis usually means a better prognosis.

The tests involved in our Pet MOT are quick and non invasive. A Vet performs a general health check which includes assessing your pets eyes, heart, teeth, weight and body condition. They may discuss your pet's eating habits and lifestyle, as well as being happy to advise you on any other areas of pet care.

A blood and a urine sample will also be taken. The urine sample will be analysed in house, however the blood
